File Naming and Organizing

No spaces

Use a hyphen if you need to separate words

(Underscores work also, but may be harder to see if the link in displayed with the typical underline style.

About us

About-us

Keep file names short

Someone is probably going to have to type it or copy into an email so if you can shorten learnaboutus.html to just about.html it is better

No special characters or punctuation

/ % & * , # etc.

Use lower case

Some servers are case sensitive, and will not find your file named About.html if you type about.html as the link reference. It is just easier to stick with all lower case


Do not use numbers as the first character

Use html as the extension

.html was original, then .htm came along for Windows servers. Today either are OK, but stick with one.

Basic file structure

Create a containing folder for all your files related to the exercise. Inside the container folder you should have an assets folder and a website folder. Inside the website folder you should have a css, js, and images folder.
